Total Courses Discipline Updates

Social Work & Human Services (SWHS) 120 Descriptor Change

The Social Work & Human Services Faculty Discipline Review Group (FDRG) have reviewed the SWHS 120 descriptor to ensure that it remains consistent with practices in the field. As a result, the FDRG split the descriptor into two separate courses, as opposed to one course comprised of components that are inconsistent with respect to both scheduling and apportionment.

The two (2) course descriptors, SWHS 120 A & SWHS 120 B, have been finalized and are now posted on the C-ID website under the <u>Descriptors</u> tab. The Social Work and Human Services <u>Transfer Model Curriculum</u> (TMC) has also been updated to reflect these changes.

Please note that per C-ID policy, colleges with courses submitted to C-ID will have up to one year to resubmit to C-ID for review.
